ICD primarily partners with the Housing Authority of the City of Alameda to develop new affordable homes.

Who governs Island City Development?

The Board of Directors is the governing body of ICD. The volunteer Board of Directors is comprised of the Housing Authority Executive Director, a current or past Housing Authority employee, and a current member of AHA's Board of Commissioners.
